

The School Health Education Advisory Council met January 19 at 5:30 p.m. in the cafetorium with 9 members present.

First on the agenda for discussion is the drug testing for all extracurricular student's seventh grades and up. A committee was formed for purpose of making recommendations to the board for the extracurricular drug testing policy. Mr. Jarrett spoke about the process. The policy developed by the committee and the school board was sent to TASB Policy Services for review and will be presented to the school board at a meeting on Thursday, January 22. Mr. Jarrett is hopeful that we will conduct one or two random tests this spring. There will be a parent meeting for students and parents to sign up before any testing occurs.

Next on the agenda was the p.e. curriculum for elementary and middle school. With the renovation, coach changes, and new principal, the CATCH curriculum has not been found and the middle school p.e. curriculum was not ordered. I will meet with Mr. Jarrett this week and we will get it ordered.

We discussed doing a FIVE-A-DAY activity in the cafetorium with moms volunteering to come and help serve the kids different fruits and vegetables. Trudy McArthur is going to help decide a date and time and what foods will be served. We will contact Invenergy for possible donations to purchase these foods.

Plans are being made to bring the "Shattered Dreams" program to Spur Secondary School on April 14, 15, 16. This program is designed to help teenagers make wise choices about drinking, drugs, and driving. Prom is scheduled for April 18. Chris Shultz from TABC is scheduled to come to Spur for a Shattered Dreams meeting with community members Thursday, January 22 to help us with preparation.
